To have over 30 in attendance was a great accomplishment! Our presenter was Chris Schaffner of Jolt Foundation. Chris delivered an informative and valuable presentation. Chris outlined the origins of Jolt and its progress in the community. Chris described in detail the services that Jolt Foundation offers. Mr. Schaffner also showed how the RCO of Jolt aligns with the Peoria County ROSC. There were easy view slides that showed the continuum of care between an RCO and a ROSC council. Jolt had paid staff and volunteer staff on hand that walked us through a typical day at work, or a volunteer's duties. A very informative Q and A session followed the presentation. Chris stressed the importance of why Jolt Foundation is no longer called "Jolt Harm Reduction". The reason for that is that Jolt provides many more services than just Harm Reduction. Council members were engaged and appreciated the presentation and information a great deal. PCR Coordinator has met with council members, colleagues, and superiors to discuss the strategic plan and the trajectory of the Peoria County ROSC. There is great momentum at this present time. Many future collaborations and events are in the planning process.
